The principle was in the classroom on Friday to give the top three prizes for the students, and he and all the students were in a happy mood as well!



I am positive that every student in the class had one of the best experience that week, and a great one week of my teaching. I was very happy to see all the kids faces, as they used to enter the room, and they used to sing a song for introduction, and every single person was well behaved and they all treated each other with fair respect. Also during some of the school time, I used to show them where my house was located back in America. I used to show them my family and friends in America and they were just really amazed and just wished for a bright future for themselves. I know every single one of them will all go in an awesome career and they will all succeed in their life. During the class time, we used to play some fun games relating to education, sing some Indian songs and just have a great time in the classroom setting.
